- December 8. Our accompanist, Alice Song, is out sick, so we have an a capella service this morning.
 But Lambert is back to assist Parson John, and the Speckman family Blanca and Joe, plus Logan and Chris lights the Advent candle.
- December 2. One of the highlights of today's service is the Christmas music <u>"Mary Did You Know?"</u> so beautifully sung by Mikaela McFarland Curtis.
- And, speaking of "PK's", **Stephawn Spears** is back among us today to teach Sunday School. Stephawn told us of an interesting article about his brother, **Marcel Spears**, who is one of the stars of the TV show, "The Neighborhood". - **December 1.** At today's food distribution, we were joined once again by members of our own **<u>Cub Pack</u> 1294**, and their parents, who wish to continue to serve regularly as our first-Saturday volunteer group. We welcome their participation, and hope they'll be able to do so.
- **November 25. Alice Song** is unavailable, but sends her good friend, **Sarah Cheng**, to accompany our worship. Sarah has been with us several times in the past, and brings her husband and three beautiful children with her today. Parson John's inspiring message is once again based on the theme of **"Priming the Pump"**, and he uses the same prop as last week to help us visualise our support for our church.
- **November 18.** At this morning's service, we welcome six of our preschool teachers, as we celebrate the role which the **Orangethorpe United Methodist Preschool** plays in our mission. An old-fashioned hand pump is the prop for Parson John's message **Substantial Faith: Bethlehem Water**. We rejoice that our sister **Lorri Goldman** has returned to our midst after several months' absence due to health problems, and we pray for our sister **Mary Lou Pemberton**, who has just had surgery.
- November 17. When people ask me how many families receive groceries at our Saturday morning food distributions, I usually tell them, "Oh, about a hundred." Well, this morning, for the second time in recent months, we serve exactly 100 families!, with a lot of help from St. Jude Medical Center's Education Department employees.
- **November 11.** Cub Pack 1294 joins us yet again, leading the flag salute at our Sunday morning worship service, as we celebrate Veterans Day. Parson John is back from Big Bear and kicks off a sermon series built around the theme of **Prime the Pump!**
- **November 4.** Parson John and his family are vacationing in Big Bear. This morning's worship is led by our gifted musicians, **Alice Song** and **Nate Brown**.
- **November 3.** This morning, we distribute food from the Second Harvest Food Bank to 106 neighbor families, and we are assisted by no less that *fifty-five (55)* members of our own <u>Cub Pack 1294</u>, and their parents. However, outdoor services were held today and they are doing a wonderful job of helping their neighbors, who were affected by the hurricane, including providing food to hurricane victims.
